Message from the Chaplain, Father Steve...

Each year, as Lent approaches, many of us find ourselves asking what we should "give up for Lent." Though it is not mandatory, we have been conditioned to do so. There is a popular theory that Christ gave up His life that we, too, should give something up. Another notion is that Lent is often a time for reflective prayer and meditation that fasting should naturally occur. But indeed, where did this idea come from? We can turn to the Old Testament and see an example in Daniel: *"Then I turned my face to the Lord God, seeking him by prayer and pleas for mercy with fasting and sackcloth and ashes."* (Daniel 9:3) Here's what Jesus had to say about fasting: *"so that men will not notice your fasting, but by your Father who is in secret; and your Father who sees what is done in secret will reward you."* (Matthew 6:18)

As Knights of Columbus, we understand that sacrifice, prayer and almsgiving are essential. Through our collective effort, those who are less fortunate can find peace and love in a society marked with violence. Each of us promised to support our Church and our Order through Charity, Unity, and Fraternalism.
